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ROCKY MOUNTAIN HOCKEY LEAGUE RULES & REGULATIONS - Summer Season

1. All teams are required to pay for a minimum of 16 players and are allowed to register a maximum of 20 players. Any teams wishing to register less than 16 players must make up the monetary difference accordingly. The cut off date for roster deletions and additions for the Summer season is July 1st.
2. All teams are required to have matching jerseys with permanent numbers. This also applies to the goaltender. Players without matching team jerseys will not be allowed to participate in any games until they have complied with this rule.
3. Teams are allowed to use substitute goaltenders from the "RMHL Current Season Goalies List", which all Game Representatives will have an updated copy of. However, only goaltenders from your team's division or lower are eligible to substitute for your team. If necessary, your team may use a goalie one division higher, but only if all other goalies have been contacted.
4. All players are required to wear helmets, but half-shields or full face masks are optional.
5. All teams are required to present a team roster, complete with jersey numbers and "DNP" for players not playing, to the RMHL Game Representative at least 10 minutes prior to the game starting time.
6. If a team questions the eligibility of a player, they must ask the Game Representative (not the referees) to ask the Captain of the team on which the player in question is playing for a picture ID. The picture ID must match the player in question and a name on the official roster (copies are also acceptable). It is strongly recommended that all Captains carry photocopies of every player's picture ID as most players leave their wallets and other valuables locked in their cars. **Any team found to be using players not on the official roster will receive an automatic forfeit of that game plus a cancellation and forfeit of their next game.**
7. The Rocky Mountain Hockey League uses on-ice officials from the Colorado Ice Hockey Referees Association. It is their job to assess minor, major and misconduct penalties as well as game misconduct, gross misconduct and match penalties. Their decisions on these matters are final and not open to debate.
8. Any player who receives a major penalty and game misconduct will be assessed an automatic one (1) game suspension. Any player who receives two (2) game misconducts during the summer season will be suspended for the balance of the season, including playoffs. Game suspensions will carry over to the playoffs.
9. If a player accumulates thirty (30) minutes in penalties during the Summer Season they will be assessed an automatic one (1) game suspension. If that player accumulates forty(40) minutes in penalties during the Summer Season they will be suspended for the remainder of the season including playoffs. Game suspensions will carry over to the playoffs.
10. Full payment of player registration fees are due before the start of the season. Any players who fail to pay their entire fee before the first game will not be allowed to play in any games until monies are received by the League. There will be no exceptions to this rule.
11. Fines will be assessed to players that receive game and/or match penalties. A \$25 fine will be assessed to any player receiving a game misconduct for any offense other than a fighting misconduct. A \$50 fine will be assessed to any player receiving a game misconduct for fighting. A \$50 fine will be assessed to any player receiving a match/gross misconduct penalty. All fines must be paid before the player is eligible to return.
